

# Scripture Memory For 2010

Week No.	Verse and Reference
1	<b>Joshua 1:9</b> Have not I commanded thee? Be strong and of a good courage; be not afraid, neither be thou dismayed: for the LORD thy God <i>is</i> with thee whithersoever thou goest.
2	<b>2 Chronicles 16:9a</b> For the eyes of the LORD run to and fro throughout the whole earth, to shew himself strong in the behalf of <i>them</i> whose heart <i>is</i> perfect toward him.
3	<b>Colossians 3:1-3</b> If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth on the right hand of God. Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth. For ye are dead, and your life is hid with Christ in God.
4	<b>1 Corinthians 13:4-7</b> Charity suffereth long, <i>and</i> is kind; charity envieth not; charity vaunteth not itself, is not puffed up, Doth not behave itself unseemly, seeketh not her own, is not easily provoked, thinketh no evil; Rejoiceth not in iniquity, but rejoiceth in the truth; Beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things.
5	<b>Psalms 27:1-5</b> The LORD <i>is</i> my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? the LORD <i>is</i> the strength of my life; of whom shall I be afraid? When the wicked, <i>even</i> mine enemies and my foes, came upon me to eat up my flesh, they stumbled and fell. Though an host should encamp against me, my heart shall not fear: though war should rise against me, in this <i>will</i> I <i>be</i> confident. One <i>thing</i> have I desired of the LORD, that will I seek after; that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life, to behold the beauty of the LORD, and to enquire in his temple. For in the time of trouble he shall hide me in his pavilion: in the secret of his tabernacle shall he hide me; he shall set me up upon a rock.
6	<b>Psalms 27:13-14</b> <i>I had fainted</i> , unless I had believed to see the goodness of the LORD in the land of the living. Wait on the LORD: be of good courage, and he shall strengthen thine heart: wait, I say, on the LORD.
7	<b>Philippians 2:10-11</b> That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of <i>things</i> in heaven, and <i>things</i> in earth, and <i>things</i> under the earth; And <i>that</i> every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ <i>is</i> Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
8	<b>Philippians 4:6-8</b> Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus. Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things <i>are</i> honest, whatsoever things <i>are</i> just, whatsoever things <i>are</i> pure, whatsoever things <i>are</i> lovely, whatsoever things <i>are</i> of good report; if <i>there be</i> any virtue, and if <i>there be</i> any praise, think on these things.
9	<b>Psalms 30:4-5</b> Sing unto the LORD, O ye saints of his, and give thanks at the remembrance of his holiness. For his anger <i>endureth but</i> a moment; in his favour <i>is</i> life: weeping may endure for a night, but joy <i>cometh</i> in the morning.
10	<b>Psalms 32:8-9</b> I will instruct thee and teach thee in the way which thou shalt go: I will guide thee with mine eye. Be ye not as the horse, <i>or</i> as the mule, <i>which</i> have no understanding: whose mouth must be held in with bit and bridle, lest they come near unto thee.
11	<b>Matthew 20:26b-27</b> But whosoever will be great among you, let him be your minister; And whosoever will be chief among you, let him be your servant:

12	<b>Matthew 22:37-38</b> Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment.
13	<b>Proverbs 15:1</b> A soft answer turneth away wrath: but grievous words stir up anger.
14	<b>Proverbs 16:24</b> Pleasant words <i>are as</i> an honeycomb, sweet to the soul, and health to the bones.
15	<b>Romans 12:9-13</b> <i>Let</i> love be without dissimulation. Abhor that which is evil; cleave to that which is good. <i>Be</i> kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another; Not slothful in business; fervent in spirit; serving the Lord; Rejoicing in hope; patient in tribulation; continuing instant in prayer; Distributing to the necessity of saints; given to hospitality.
16	<b>Romans 12:14-16</b> Bless them which persecute you: bless, and curse not. Rejoice with them that do rejoice, and weep with them that weep. <i>Be</i> of the same mind one toward another. Mind not high things, but condescend to men of low estate. Be not wise in your own conceits.
17	<b>Romans 12:17-19</b> Recompense to no man evil for evil. Provide things honest in the sight of all men. If it be possible, as much as lieth in you, live peaceably with all men. Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but <i>rather</i> give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance <i>is</i> mine; I will repay, saith the Lord.
18	<b>Romans 12:20-21</b> Therefore if thine enemy hunger, feed him; if he thirst, give him drink: for in so doing thou shalt heap coals of fire on his head. Be not overcome of evil, but overcome evil with good.
19	<b>Proverbs 31:30</b> Favour <i>is</i> deceitful, and beauty <i>is</i> vain: <i>but</i> a woman <i>that</i> feareth the LORD, she shall be praised.
20	<b>Isaiah 26:3-4</b> Thou wilt keep <i>him</i> in perfect peace, <i>whose</i> mind <i>is</i> stayed <i>on thee</i> : because he trusteth in thee. Trust ye in the LORD for ever: for in the LORD JEHOVAH <i>is</i> everlasting strength.
21	<b>1 John 3:1-2</b> Behold, what manner of love the Father hath bestowed upon us, that we should be called the sons of God: therefore the world knoweth us not, because it knew him not. Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is.
22	<b>1 John 4:4</b> Greater is he that is in you, than he that is in the world.
23	<b>Psalms 42:11</b> Why art thou cast down, O my soul? and why art thou disquieted within me? hope thou in God: for I shall yet praise him, <i>who is</i> the health of my countenance, and my God.
24	<b>Psalms 55:22</b> Cast thy burden upon the LORD, and he shall sustain thee: he shall never suffer the righteous to be moved.
25	<b>James 4:16-17</b> But now ye rejoice in your boastings: all such rejoicing is evil. Therefore to him that knoweth to do good, and doeth <i>it</i> not, to him it is sin.
26	<b>1 Peter 2:9-10</b> But ye <i>are</i> a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light: Which in time past <i>were</i> not a people, but <i>are</i> now the people of God: which had not obtained mercy, but now have obtained mercy.

27	<b>Psalm 96:1-3</b> O sing unto the LORD a new song: sing unto the LORD, all the earth. Sing unto the LORD, bless his name; shew forth his salvation from day to day. Declare his glory among the heathen, his wonders among all people.
28	<b>Psalm 96:4-7</b> For the LORD <i>is</i> great, and greatly to be praised: he <i>is</i> to be feared above all gods. For all the gods of the nations <i>are</i> idols: but the LORD made the heavens. Honour and majesty <i>are</i> before him: strength and beauty <i>are</i> in his sanctuary. Give unto the LORD, O ye kindreds of the people, give unto the LORD glory and strength.
29	<b>Psalm 96:8-10</b> Give unto the LORD the glory <i>due unto</i> his name: bring an offering, and come into his courts. O worship the LORD in the beauty of holiness: fear before him, all the earth. Say among the heathen <i>that</i> the LORD reigneth: the world also shall be established that it shall not be moved: he shall judge the people righteously.
30	<b>Psalm 100</b> Make a joyful noise unto the LORD, all ye lands. Serve the LORD with gladness: come before his presence with singing. Know ye that the LORD he <i>is</i> God: <i>it is</i> he <i>that</i> hath made us, and not we ourselves; <i>we are</i> his people, and the sheep of his pasture. Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, <i>and</i> into his courts with praise: be thankful unto him, <i>and</i> bless his name. For the LORD <i>is</i> good; his mercy <i>is</i> everlasting; and his truth <i>endureth</i> to all generations.
31	<b>John 8:31-32</b> If ye continue in my word, <i>then</i> are ye my disciples indeed; And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.
32	<b>John 8:51</b> Verily, verily, I say unto you, If a man keep my saying, he shall never see death.
33	<b>Isaiah 65:24</b> And it shall come to pass, that before they call, I will answer; and while they are yet speaking, I will hear.
34	<b>Jeremiah 1:7-8</b> But the LORD said unto me, Say not, I <i>am</i> a child: for thou shalt go to all that I shall send thee, and whatsoever I command thee thou shalt speak. Be not afraid of their faces: for I <i>am</i> with thee to deliver thee, saith the LORD.
35	<b>Hebrews 3:12-13</b> Take heed, brethren, lest there be in any of you an evil heart of unbelief, in departing from the living God. But exhort one another daily, while it is called To day; lest any of you be hardened through the deceitfulness of sin.
36	<b>Hebrews 10:39</b> But we are not of them who draw back unto perdition; but of them that believe to the saving of the soul.
37	<b>Proverbs 22:1</b> A <i>good</i> name <i>is</i> rather to be chosen than great riches, <i>and</i> loving favour rather than silver and gold.
38	<b>Proverbs 26:20</b> Where no wood is, <i>there</i> the fire goeth out: so where <i>there is</i> no talebearer, the strife ceaseth.
39	<b>Psalm 18:30-31</b> <i>As for</i> God, his way <i>is</i> perfect: the word of the LORD is tried: he <i>is</i> a buckler to all those that trust in him. For who <i>is</i> God save the LORD? or who <i>is</i> a rock save our God?
40	<b>Psalm 19:7-11</b> The law of the LORD <i>is</i> perfect, converting the soul: the testimony of the LORD <i>is</i> sure, making wise the simple. The statutes of the LORD <i>are</i> right, rejoicing the heart: the commandment of the LORD <i>is</i> pure, enlightening the eyes. The fear of the LORD <i>is</i> clean, enduring for ever: the judgments of the LORD <i>are</i> true <i>and</i> righteous altogether. More to be desired <i>are they</i> than gold, yea, than much fine gold: sweeter also than honey and the honeycomb. Moreover by them is thy servant warned: <i>and</i> in keeping of them <i>there is</i> great reward.
41	<b>1 Timothy 6:6</b> But godliness with contentment is great gain.

42	<b>Psalm 37:1-2</b> Fret not thyself because of evildoers, neither be thou envious against the workers of iniquity. For they shall soon be cut down like the grass, and wither as the green herb.
43	<b>Psalm 37:3-4</b> Trust in the LORD, and do good; <i>so</i> shalt thou dwell in the land, and verily thou shalt be fed. Delight thyself also in the LORD; and he shall give thee the desires of thine heart.
44	<b>Psalm 37:5-6</b> Commit thy way unto the LORD; trust also in him; and he shall bring <i>it</i> to pass. And he shall bring forth thy righteousness as the light, and thy judgment as the noonday.
45	<b>Psalm 37:7</b> Rest in the LORD, and wait patiently for him: fret not thyself because of him who prospereth in his way, because of the man who bringeth wicked devices to pass.
46	<b>Psalm 37:8-9</b> Cease from anger, and forsake wrath: fret not thyself in any wise to do evil. For evildoers shall be cut off: but those that wait upon the LORD, they shall inherit the earth.
47	<b>Psalm 37:23-24</b> The steps of a <i>good</i> man are ordered by the LORD: and he delighteth in his way. Though he fall, he shall not be utterly cast down: for the LORD upholdeth <i>him with</i> his hand.
48	<b>1 Corinthians 10:31</b> Whether therefore ye eat, or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God.
49	<b>Colossians 4:6</b> Let your speech <i>be</i> alway with grace, seasoned with salt, that ye may know how ye ought to answer every man.
50	<b>Isaiah 43:25</b> I, <i>even</i> I, <i>am</i> he that blotteth out thy transgressions for mine own sake, and will not remember thy sins.
51	<b>Isaiah 46:3-4</b> Hearken unto me, O house of Jacob, and all the remnant of the house of Israel, which are borne <i>by me</i> from the belly, which are carried from the womb: And <i>even</i> to <i>your</i> old age I <i>am</i> he; and <i>even</i> to hoar hairs will I carry <i>you</i> : I have made, and I will bear; even I will carry, and will deliver <i>you</i> .
